ACTIVITY REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE 2011

The Full Committee conducted the following hearings and/or meetings during the month of June 2011:

- Wednesday, June 1, 2011—The Full Committee held an Oversight Hearing on the "American Energy Initiative: Identifying Roadblocks to Wind and Solar Energy on Public Lands and Waters, Part II - The Wind and Solar Industry Perspective."
- Wednesday, June 15, 2011—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 295, to amend the Hydrographic Services Improvement Act of 1998 to authorize funds to acquire hydrographic data and provide hydrographic services specific to the Arctic for safe navigation, delineating the United States extended continental shelf, and the monitoring and description of coastal changes.
- Wednesday, June 15, 2011—The Full Committee held a Markup held on H.R. 320, to designate a Distinguished Flying Cross National Memorial at the March Field Air Museum in Riverside, California.
- Wednesday, June 15, 2011—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 441, to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to issue permits for a microhydro project in nonwilderness areas within the boundaries of Denali National Park and Preserve, to acquire land for Denali National Park and Preserve from Doyon Tourism, Inc., and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, June 15, 2011—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 470, to further allocate and expand the availability of hydroelectric power generated at Hoover Dam, and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, June 15, 2011—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 489, to clarify the jurisdiction of the Secretary of the Interior with respect to the C.C. Cragin Dam and Reservoir, and for other purposes.

- Wednesday, June 15, 2011—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 643, to provide for the exchange of certain land located in the Arapaho-Roosevelt National Forests in the State of Colorado, and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, June 15, 2011—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 670, to convey certain submerged lands to the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands in order to give that territory the same benefits in its submerged lands as Guam, the Virgin Islands, and American Samoa have in their submerged lands.
