COMMITTEE ON ETHICS

January 2019

The activities of the Committee on Ethics (Committee) in January 2019 spanned the 115th Congress, which ended on January 3, 2019, and the 116th Congress, which began the same day. In the 115th Congress, the Committee was led by Chairwoman Susan W. Brooks and Ranking Member Theodore E. Deutch. In the 116th Congress, the Committee will be led by Chairman Theodore E. Deutch and Ranking Member Kenny Marchant.

In January 2019, the Committee took several actions relating to its work during the 115th Congress. First, with respect to its work providing advice and education to the House, on January 2, 2019, the Committee released two general advisory opinions, *Negotiations for Future Employment and Restrictions on Post-Employment for House Staff* and *Negotiations for Future Employment and Restrictions on Post-Employment for House Members and Officers*. Prior general advisory opinions are available on the Committee's website at https://ethics.house.gov/.

Second, with respect to its investigative work, on January 2, 2019, the Committee released a public statement regarding the matter of Representative Thomas Garrett. Chairwoman Brooks and Ranking Member Deutch released the public statement and a staff report written by the Committee's nonpartisan staff, which are available on the Committee's website.

Third, the Committee issued two reports summarizing its work in the 115th Congress. One report, issued to the House, summarizes all of the Committee's work in the 115th Congress. That report is also available on the Committee's website and on the website of the Congress, at https://www.congress.gov/. The other report, issued to the Committee on House Administration, is a regular summary of its activity by month and describes the Committee's activities in December 2018. That report and other previous monthly reports are publicly available on the Committee on House Administration's website, https://cha.house.gov/.

As the Committee began its work in the 116th Congress, it continued to fulfill its responsibilities to advise and educate Members and staff on the laws, rules, and standards of conduct.² As a general matter, the Committee's activities in receiving and responding to requests for advice from House Members and staff are conducted on a confidential basis. The Committee received 32 requests for advisory opinions in January 2019.

In accordance with the Rules of the House of Representatives for the 116th Congress, the Committee continued to review and approve requests to accept privately-sponsored, officially-connected travel. The Committee received and reviewed 194 new travel requests in January 2019 for travel beginning in January or later. In addition, 37 House travelers went on privately-

sponsored, officially connected trips within the month of January that the Committee previously approved.

Finally, the Committee is required under House rules to offer annual ethics training to each Member, Delegate, Resident Commissioner, officer, and employee of the House. Such training is mandatory for all House Members, officers, and employees. New Members, officers, and employees must receive training no later than 60 days after beginning service to the House. The Committee continued to provide such training in January 2019. The Committee provided live training sessions attended by 341 individuals in January 2019. The Committee also continued to provide training online and through a number of training videos.
