COMMITTEE ON ETHICS

February 2019

As the Committee on Ethics (Committee) began its work in the 116th Congress, it continued to fulfill its responsibilities to advise and educate Members and staff on the laws, rules, and standards of conduct.¹ As a general matter, the Committee's activities in receiving and responding to requests for advice from House Members and staff are conducted on a confidential basis. The Committee received 46 requests for advisory opinions in February 2019.

In accordance with the Rules of the House of Representatives for the 116th Congress, the Committee continued to review and approve requests to accept privately-sponsored, officially-connected travel. The Committee received and reviewed 129 new travel requests in January 2019 for travel beginning in February or later. In addition, 192 House travelers went on privately-sponsored, officially connected trips within the month of February that the Committee previously approved.

In February 2019, the Committee took several actions. First, with respect to its work providing advice and education to the House, on February 8, 2019, the Committee released two general advisory opinions, *The 2019 Outside Earned Income Limit and Salaries Triggering the Financial Disclosure Requirement and Post-Employment Restrictions Applicable to House Officers and Employees* and *Reminder of Ethics Requirements for Financial Disclosure Filers*. These and prior general advisory opinions are available on the Committee's website at <https://ethics.house.gov/>.

Second, the Committee held its organizational meeting for the 116th Congress on February 27, 2019. The Committee provided prior public notice of the meeting and during a portion of the meeting that was open to the public adopted rules for the current Congress.

As discussed during the public portion of the meeting, following recommendations from the Committee's nonpartisan staff, the Committee made several changes to its rules, which generally fell into one of three categories. First, staff recommended modifications to reflect corresponding changes to law or House Rules. For example, staff recommended and the Committee agreed to include new language reflecting changes made by the Congressional Accountability Act Reform Act of 2018 and providing for confidentiality of information received from the Office of Congressional Workplace Rights (formerly the Office of Compliance). Second, staff recommended and the Committee agreed to include changes to harmonize existing Committee practices with Committee rules. For example, the Committee updated a rule regarding rights of witnesses to expressly clarify that witnesses may be provided a copy of Committee rules by email. Third, staff recommended and the Committee agreed to include purely typographical

changes, such as inconsistencies with capitalization. The Committee has made its rules publicly available on its website and submitted them for publication in the Congressional Record.

Finally, the Committee is required under House rules to offer annual ethics training to each Member, Delegate, Resident Commissioner, officer, and employee of the House. Such training is mandatory for all House Members, officers, and employees. New Members, officers, and employees must receive training no later than 60 days after beginning service to the House. The Committee continued to provide such training in February 2019. The Committee provided live training sessions attended by 357 individuals in February 2019. The Committee also continued to provide training online and through a number of training videos.
