COMMITTEE ON ETHICS

July 2019

The Committee on Ethics (Committee) continued to fulfill its responsibilities to advise and educate Members and staff on the laws, rules, and standards of conduct.¹ As a general matter, the Committee's activities in receiving and responding to requests for advice from House Members and staff are conducted on a confidential basis. The Committee received 58 requests for advisory opinions in July 2019.

In accordance with the Rules of the House of Representatives for the 116th Congress, the Committee continued to review and approve requests to accept privately-sponsored, officially-connected travel. The Committee received and reviewed 371 new travel requests in July 2019 for travel beginning in July or later. In addition, 51 House travelers went on privately-sponsored, officially connected trips within the month of July that the Committee previously approved.

In addition, the Committee is required under House rules to offer annual ethics training to each Member, Delegate, Resident Commissioner, officer, and employee of the House. Such training is mandatory for all House officers and employees. New Members, officers, and employees must receive training no later than 60 days after beginning service to the House. The Committee continued to provide such training in July of 2019. The Committee provided live training sessions attended by 293 individuals in July of 2019. The Committee also continued to provide training online and through a number of training videos. Additional information about the calendar of upcoming in-person training sessions and online training opportunities is available on the Committee's website at https://ethics.house.gov/.

In July 2019, the Committee issued a summary of its activities for June 2019 directed to the Committee on House Administration. This statement is publicly available on the Committee on House Administration's website.

The Committee released one public statement in July 2019 about a Notice of Public Session. The Committee appointed a bipartisan working group to draft proposed regulations governing House Members, officers, and employees' outside positions. The working group consists of Representative Susan Wild and Representative Van Taylor. On July 25, 2019, the Outside Positions Working Group held a public session to assist them in drafting regulations. The full Committee will vote to adopt final regulations no later than December 31, 2019. Prior public statements are available on the Committee's website at https://ethics.house.gov/.
